White Wines

Moonlake Clare Valley Riesling 2018 (12%)

Situated in the northern Mount Lofty Ranges, the Clare Valley is home to some of Australia's finest wine names. The long, drawn out ripening period of the Valley ensures maximum aromas, depth and freshness - ideal for top class Rieslings. Rivetingly fresh and dry with ripe green apple and citrus on the nose and palate.

Lost World Fiano 2021 (12.5%)

Meet our new Lost World made from the southern Italian grape, Fiano. This unsung hero turns out wines with freshness, fragrance and finesse. Cherry-picked from the best sites in the Murray Darling region, Lost World is brimful of white peach and creamy citrus fruit, nicely rounded too.

Ten Minutes By Tractor Chardonnay 2018 (13%)

Australia's Mornington Peninsula is where cool-climate wines are crafted within fascinating wineries. The grapes are hand-harvested, whole bunch pressed and fermented in a mixture of new and old French oak barrels and aged for eleven months. With added hints of toasty vanilla, it's a sophisticated, mouthwatering white wine. A great Chardonnay.

Red Wines

Blue Belle Graciano 2018 (14.5%)

This fabulous, ripe, big on fruit red comes from a family vineyard in One Tree Hill, Adelaide. Fermented in small, open top wooden fermenters and hand plunged. Rich and velvety. Aged in French and American oak casks for a year, then kept back another 12 months.

Black Stump 50th Anniversary Durif 2019 (15%)

Our all-time customer favourite Black Stump. For this special edition, the winemaker used 100% Durif – pure, dark and dangerously delicious. Pulsing with dark chocolate richness, black fruit and sumptuous spice.

The Good Doctor's Tonic 2016 (15%)

Being a doctor can be stressful, so what better way to unwind than nurture a few grapes, hand plunge a few vats and guide the precious wine into a barrel. Only the richest, ripest grapes are selected and then processed in the old-fashioned way – on a miniature scale with basket presses and open-topped fermenters. The aim: to make a red with the firm 'legs' for ageing. Skilfully blended dark, ripe Tannat (very rare in Oz) with Cabernet and Shiraz. A rich mouthful with mellow fruit, spicy oak and mint.

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
