Sapatio Mtsvane 2021 Kakheti Georgia



Georgia is a forgotten jewel of the wine world, thought to be the original source of wine 8,000 years ago. Meet here its native Mtsvane grape in a bright, peach-fruit white from a cellar that wowed the judges at IWC 2020 to win the top Trophy. Symposium Cellars "14/27" Agiorgitiko 2019 Nemea Greece Nemea is one of Greece's most important regions for red wine. It's main star is the Agiorgitiko grape, which thrives on the mineral-rich, red clay soils which help bring out complexity and freshness in a wine. Revel here in the bright red fruits tempered by subtle vanilla spice from ageing in part new French oak barrels.

Kutjevo Grasevina 2022 Slavonia Croatia



Nestled in Croatia's Slavonia region, the historic Kutjevo winery traces its roots to 1232. Meet Graševina, the reigning queen of Croatia's white grapes. It has fresh apple and peach fruit, underlined by a saline, citrus zip.

Radacini Wines "Albastrele" Cabernet Sauvignon 2020 Cimislia Moldova Cabernet Sauvignon is known to be the hero of Bordeaux. But this thickskinned berry also excels in Moldova. It's a country with a strong winemaking history, as well as a handful of award-winning modern wineries -Albastrele being one of these. Since its launch over a decade ago, Albastrele has amassed awards in Europe for nearly every vintage. It shows just how perfect for winemaking the Black Sea-influenced climate in Moldova really is.

The Royal Tokaji Wine Company Furmint 2022 Tokaj Hungary



Spearheaded by one of the world's favourite wine writers, Hugh Johnson. "I had to wait for the Iron Curtain to come down before I could start up my dream," he reflected. It was worth the wait, as you'll taste with the 2022 vintage. Aged in new oak, it blends bright, crisp fruit with spice. Excellent with creamy chicken dishes.

100 Anos Tannat Gimenez Mendez 2022 Canelones Uruguay

From a winery awarded the 'World's Best Tannat', this is a fabulous new find. It's from Gimenez Mendez, an estate founded by husband and wife team Luis Alberto Gimenez and Marta Mendez. Marta is, in fact, one of the prime movers in Uruguay's wine industry. Hand picked grapes, carefully fermented and aged in oak produces a lovely balance in the wine. A definite for steak!
