<p>2.</p>	<p>2021 Frascole Chianti Classico Rufina</p> <p>From the coolest, highest part of Chianti, giving wines with delicate aromas and higher acidity than many Chianti areas.</p>	<p>The Wine Society</p>
<p>3.</p>	<p>2021 Chianti Classico, Castello di Volpaia</p> <p>A beautifully balanced wine from the new generation of Chianti Classico producers.</p>	<p>The Wine Society</p>
<p>4.</p>	<p>2021 Rosso di Montalcino Il Poggione</p> <p>From a top Brunello producer. Beautifully ripe grapes and intense flavours demonstrate the Brunello clone of Sangiovese.</p>	<p>Great Wine Company</p>
